STANDING ORDER REGARDING 2020 COVID-19 STIMULUS

COMES NOW the aforementioned Courts to consider the receipt, disbursement and/or safekeeping of 2020 COVID-19 Stimulus Money when operating under Temporary Orders. The Courts understand that these monies will be distributed to a single bank account or a particular recipient and other parties may have a claim to a portion of the funds. To reduce uncertainty and further litigation, the aforementioned Courts of Lamar County, Texas, make the following Standing Orders:

- A. Within TWENTY-FOUR HOURS of receipt, the receiving party is to notify their spouse, ex-spouse, parent of their children or any person having custody of the receiving party's child or children that COVID-19 Stimulus monies were received. That notice is to include the total amount received and the location of the monies.
- B. Absent a written agreement regarding the disbursement of any monies, the party receiving the money is to hold said money in safekeeping until further Order of their respective Court. Failure to comply with this Order of Safekeeping could result in a finding of contempt which is punishable by jailing and/or a fine. Furthermore, attorney's fees could be awarded if litigation is necessary to enforce this Order of Safekeeping.
